# MAUI HEALTH COVID-19 VACCINE CLINIC Step-by-step guide

**DO YOU QUALIFY?** Maui Health will provide vaccinations to community members **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY** who are included in the <u>Centers for Disease Control (CDC) identified Phase 1A, Phase 1B, Phase 1C (starting March 15) vaccine prioritization timeline</u>. This includes Hawaii residents who are:

- 1. Healthcare Workers
- 2. Frontline Essential Workers Phase 1B
- 3. Adults ages 70+

### Phase 1C individuals eligible starting March 15, 2021:

- 4. Frontline Essential Workers Phase 1C
- 5. Adults ages 65-69
- 6. Individuals ages 16-64 with high risk medical conditions

\*Pfizer vaccine only. Vaccine recipients under 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

If you qualify and would like to receive the vaccine at Maui Health, please follow these steps:

### STEP 1: Carefully review the information on our step-by-step guide prior to requesting a vaccine.

### STEP 2: Request/qualify for a vaccine by completing the Maui Health Vaccine Health Record Form.

- The Vaccine Health Record form is applicable to Maui Health Vaccine Clinic (MMMC and Kihei Clinic) locations only.
- After you've submitted the vaccine health record form, you will receive an email from the CDC/VAMS (<u>no-reply@envelope.mail.vams.cdc.gov</u>). Search for "CDC" or the subject line "*Please register in VAMS to schedule an appointment*." Please be patient, it may take a few days to receive your VAMS email. If you do not receive an email from the CDC/VAMS after 72 hours, please email <u>MH-covid-vaccine@kp.org</u>.
- DO NOT submit multiple forms. This will delay or cancel out your verification.
- Each person must have their own unique email address as this is used for their USER ID. Do not use the same email address as another person who has or will register with VAMS.

#### STEP 3: Once you receive your e-mail from the CDC/VAMS, create an account with VAMS.

- For help with VAMS, refer to the VAMS Job Aid (download).
- TIP: We highly recommend using GOOGLE CHROME to register with the VAMS system. DO NOT use Internet Explorer.

## STEP 4: After you've completed registration, schedule your appointment in VAMS. (https://vams.cdc.gov)

- You must choose a Maui Health Location in the VAMS scheduler:
  - MH MMMC Pfizer Only
  - MH Kihei Pfizer Only



# STEP 5: Complete the Insurance Information Form. (OPTIONAL, but highly recommended)

• Bring Insurance Information Form (<u>download</u>) on the day of your appointment to streamline your appointment. Otherwise, you'll need to fill it out at the time of appointment. (NOTE: You will not be charged for the vaccine.)

STEP 6: Register with V-Safe before you arrive for your appointment. (https://vsafe.cdc.gov/)

# **STEP 7: Complete the Pre-Vaccination Questionnaire.**

- **IN VAMS:** You will receive this from VAMS approximately 24 hours before your scheduled appointment. This must be completed prior to your appointment.
- **DOWNLOAD AND PRINT:** Complete Pre-vaccination Questionnaire (<u>download</u>) and bring on the day of your appointment to streamline your appointment. Otherwise, you'll need to fill it out at the time of appointment.

## **STEP 8: Day of appointment – arrive on time!**

- You must bring a valid ID, insurance card(s), and proof of employment (if health care worker/frontline essential worker). You will be turned away without required documentation.
- To streamline your appointment, please bring the following documents below:
  - Printed copy of your ID and insurance cards.
  - Insurance Information Form if you've already completed. Otherwise, the form will be provided at the time of appointment.
  - <u>Pre-vaccination Questionnaire</u> if you've already completed. Otherwise, the form will be provided at the time of appointment.

  - Complimentary valet service is available by the front lobby.
